**SIXTH QUARTERLY APPLICATION FOR COMPENSATION AND
REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES OF BERGER SINGERMAN, P.A., AS
CO-COUNSEL TO THE DEBTORS IN POSSESSION FOR THE PERIOD
FROM JANUARY 1, 2009 THROUGH MARCH 31, 2009**

Pursuant to sections 330 and 331 of Title 11 of the United States Code (the “Bankruptcy Code”), Rule 2016 of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure (collectively, the “Bankruptcy Rules”), and the Court’s *Administrative Order Establishing Procedures for Interim Monthly Compensation of Professionals*, entered on or about October 4, 2007 (the “Administrative Order”) (Docket No. 95), Berger Singerman, P.A. (“BSPA” or the “Firm”), co-counsel to the Debtors in Possession (“Debtors”), hereby submits its *Sixth Quarterly Application and for Reimbursement of Expenses for the Period from January 1, 2009 through March 31, 2009* (the “Application”).

By this Application, BSPA seeks a quarterly interim allowance of compensation in the amount of **\$149,577.00** and reimbursement of actual and necessary expenses in the amount of **\$3,447.73** for a total allowance of **\$153,024.73** and payment of the unpaid portion of such fees and costs for the period of January 1, 2009 through March 31, 2009 (the “Interim Period”). In support of this Application, BSPA respectfully represents as follows:

Background

1. On September 14, 2007 (the "Petition Date"), the Debtors commenced these cases (the "Chapter 11 Cases") by filing voluntary petitions for relief under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code.

2. On or about October 4, 2007, the Court entered the Administrative Order, authorizing estate professionals ("Professionals") to submit monthly applications for interim compensation and reimbursement for expenses, pursuant to the procedures specified therein. The Administrative Order provides, among other things, that a Professional may submit monthly fee applications. If no objections are made within 20 days after service of the monthly fee application the Professional may file a certificate of no objection, after which the Debtors are authorized to pay the Professional 80% of the requested fees and 100% of the requested expenses. Beginning with the period ending on December 31, 2007 and at three-month intervals, or such other intervals convenient to the Court, the Professional shall file and serve an interim application for allowance of the amounts sought in its monthly fee applications for that period. All fees and expenses paid are allowed on an interim basis until finally allowed by the Court.

3. The retention of BSPA, as co-counsel to the Debtors was approved effective as of the Petition Date by the *Order Authorizing Employment of Berger Singerman, P.A., as Co-Counsel for Debtors Nunc Pro Tunc to the Petition Date*, entered on October 4, 2007 (the "Retention Order") (Docket No. 97). The Retention Order authorized BSPA to be compensated on an hourly basis and to be reimbursed for actual and necessary out-of-pocket expenses.

**BSPA'S APPLICATION FOR COMPENSATION AND
FOR REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES**

Compensation Paid And Its Source

4. All services for which BSPA requests compensation were performed for or on behalf of the Debtors.

5. BSPA has received no payment and no promises for payment from any source for services rendered or to be rendered in any capacity whatsoever in connection with the matters covered by this Application. There is no agreement or understanding between BSPA and any other person other than the partners of BSPA for the sharing of compensation to be received for services rendered in this case. BSPA has received payments during the year prior to the Petition Date in the amount of \$425,000 from the Debtors in connection with its prepetition representation of the Debtors. Such amount includes a retainer for postpetition services in the amount of \$275,000. BSPA was current as of the Petition Date, subject to a final reconciliation of the amount actually expended prepetition. Upon final reconciliation of the amount actually expended prepetition, any balance remaining from the payments to the Firm was credited to the Debtors and utilized as BSPA's retainer to apply to postpetition fees and expenses pursuant to the compensation procedures approved by this Court and the Bankruptcy Code.

Monthly Fee Applications Covered Herein

6. The interim fee applications for the periods January 1, 2009 through March 31, 2009 of BSPA have been filed and served pursuant to the Administrative Order.

7. On February 18, 2009, BSPA filed its Seventeenth Interim Application for Compensation and for Reimbursement of Expenses as Co-Counsel to the Debtors in Possession for the Period from January 1, 2009 through January 31, 2009 [D.E. 707] ("Seventeenth Interim Application") requesting \$23,096.00 in fees and \$265.80 in expenses. Pursuant to the

Administrative Order, BSPA has been paid \$18,476.80 of the fees and \$265.80 of the requested expenses in the Seventeenth Interim Application. A true and correct copy of the Seventeenth Interim Application is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

8. On March 24, 2009, BSPA filed its Eighteenth Interim Application for Compensation and for Reimbursement of Expenses as Co-Counsel to the Debtors in Possession for the Period from February 1, 2009 through February 28, 2009 [D.E. 726] (“Eighteenth Interim Application”) requesting \$53,761/50 in fees and \$391.01 in expenses. Pursuant to the Administrative Order, BSPA has been paid \$43,009.20 of the fees and \$391.01 of the requested expenses in the Eighteenth Interim Application. A true and correct copy of the Eighteenth Interim Application is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

9. On April 27, 2009, BSPA filed its Nineteenth Interim Application for Compensation and for Reimbursement of Expenses as Co-Counsel to the Debtors in Possession for the Period from March 1, 2009 through March 31, 2009 [D.E. 748] (“Nineteenth Interim Application”) requesting \$72,719.50 in fees and \$2,790.92 in expenses. BSPA has been paid \$58,175.60 of the fees and \$2,790.92 of the requested expenses in the Nineteenth Interim application. A true and correct copy of the Nineteenth Interim Application is attached hereto as Exhibit C.

Requested Relief

10. By this Application, BSPA requests that the Court approve payment of 100% of the fees and expenses incurred by BSPA during the Interim Period of January 1, 2009 through March 31, 2009.

11. At all relevant times, BSPA has been a disinterested person as the term is defined in §101(14) of the Bankruptcy Code and has not represented or held an interest adverse to the interest of the Debtors In Possession.

12. The professional services and related expenses for which BSPA requests interim allowance of compensation and reimbursement of expenses were rendered and incurred in connection with this case in the discharge of BSPA's professional responsibilities as attorneys for the Debtors in these chapter 11 cases. BSPA's services have been necessary and beneficial to the Debtors, their estates, and other parties in interest.


13. In accordance with the factors enumerated in section 330 of the Bankruptcy Code, it is respectfully submitted that the amount requested by BSPA is fair and reasonable given the (a) the complexity of the case, (b) the time expended, (c) the nature and extent of the services rendered, (d) the value of such services, and (e) the costs of comparable services other than in a case under the Bankruptcy Code. Moreover, BSPA has reviewed the requirements of Del. Bankr. L. R. 2016-2 and the Administrative Order and believes that this Application complies with such Rule and Order.

WHEREFORE, BSPA respectfully requests that the Court enter an order, in the form attached hereto, providing that an interim allowance be made to BSPA for the period of January 1, 2009 through March 31, 2009 in the sum of **\$149,577.00** as compensation for necessary professional services rendered, and the sum of **\$3,447.73** for reimbursement of actual and necessary expenses, for a total allowance of **\$153,024.73**; that the Debtors be authorized and directed to pay to BSPA the outstanding amount of such sums; and for such other and further relief as may be just and proper.




