A couple of questions on parts I sure they'll have issues on: - Section 1:"COMPANY shall provide a bi-weekly status report to Microsoft detailing COMPANY's evaluation and testing of the PRODUCT." -I'm not clear on rationale for this. Any objections to removing it for WP?

 Section 4: "Further, COMPANY agrees to use and maintain the PRODUCT in a secure place, on a secure system, and not to disclose the PRODUCT to any person other than those individuals identified below." - I assume there's no limit on number of people they can "identify below"? I'd expect in WordPerfect's case that there would easily be 60++ people with very legimate need to have access to this information (either using the chicago pdk in development, testing, or being involved as a manger/director/vp of one of these projects). Most difficult example, is Dave Moon (VP dev), who is ultimately responsible for both the Windows Chicago version of their word processing product and OpenDoc, Are there any guidelines for people in such a position?

- Section 1: "Microsoft grants COMPANY the non-transferable right to make and use up to five (5) copies of the PRODUCT software, provided that each such copy is used only for the purposes stated above and used only by the authorized individuals described in Section 4." Similar RUGIEI
