Subject:

ISV status on Namespace Browsers/explorer extensibility

Below is a summary Scotthe pulled together from a couple of weeks ago of what ISVs current thoughts are. Only 3 ISVs have begun actual work (2 of them utility ISVs who expect to break), the rest are in the "plan to do so" stage. When Scott was speaking to most of these people on the phone, he had to educate them some on what these different terms meant. Also, a large part of the interest from ISVs doing this is because MS is doing it w/ Capone & Marvel.

Here's summary of more specific feedback we've gotten from Lotus & WordPerfect since Scott compiled his data:

Lotus - Alex Morrow (architect) is not aware of any work currently going on to implement IShellFolder, IShellView. Others we've talked to also indicate that it's in the "plan to do stage". They've asked no questions of any technical depth on these interfaces which is another indication that no work or active investigation is ongoing. For common dialogs, current plan has been to use the standard dialog extensibility and not roll their own. This may change.

Wordperfect - They have not begun any work on IShellFolder, IShellView, etc. If Capone integrates into the Explorer then they will also ("we'll figure it out if it's not documented"). If capone does not, they will just create a standalone email application. For common dialogs, current plan is to use the MS dialogs, but I don't believe they've investigated this enough to know for sure.


Here's how the shell integration API's affect our software development plans:

[MICROSOFT]

- => The Chicago shell team will make use of everything (no surprise)
- => The Chicago Networking Team including Remote Access (namespace browser and explorer extensions, briefcase reconcilers, property sheet handlers, context menu handlers)
- => Elseware Company provides the Font Folder in Chicago (namespace browser and explorer extensions, property sheet handler)
- => Office Team (gave the Chicago team the code for docfiles and continues to work on it. The document management group is using IShell Folder, IShellLink, and maybe more to do file open and save dialogs. They do something to do drag/drop of binder pages and are also using the appbar stuff - I assume to have multiple system toolbars.)
- => Capone the InfoCenter (They will do everything. They were able to do their work on other platforms the Mac, NT, and Win 3.1, by taking the shell source code and modifying it to their needs)
- => Marvel Online Service (they extend the namespace and the explorer)
- => Access (doing a file system view = namespace browsers, shell extensibility, the works)
- => Ren our PIM group (Originally Implemented totally as a shell extension. Now they are looking at briefcase reconcilers and the hot debate right now is namespace and explorer extensibility)
